3. **Write a letter to a U. S. Soldier. Guidelines:**

- Any size card or paper accepted, but do not put it in an envelope.
- Do not use glitter or attach any candy or food items to the card/letter.
- The more positive the message, the better! Care should be taken not to refer to anything that may cause grief or uneasiness to the soldier (i.e. 'I hope you don't get killed' or 'Do you miss your family?').
- Photos of the sender, the sender's family, activities or classroom photos add a personal touch to your card/letter.
- Please hand-write your letter on a **separate** piece of paper (**without the answers to #1 and #2 above**) or if you prefer, submit your letter to PAWS electronically, and PAWS will print it out for you.
